



What does the Immaculate Conception of Dardenne School Logo represent?

The basis behind the logo comes from a Mass that Monsignor Ted, our pastor, celebrated with the children on the Feast Day of the Immaculate Conception and our all school Youth Rally. Monsignor Ted's homily to the children was based on the feast day of the Immaculate Conception. During his homily he spoke of the Miraculous Medal (which is what our logo is based on). He told the children that the medal was originally called the medal of the Immaculate Conception and he explained each depiction of the medal. That day each child received a small miraculous medal as

they left Mass and went back to their classroom. This medal is the namesake of our parish.

As you look at our logo, this is what the symbolism represents:

Cross – it is the original ICD Swoosh cross that Mr. Helleney, the parish communication and website director created. This cross is all encompassing of the many facets of our parish and Mary's embracing arms. Of course the cross stands for Christ's Sacrifice.

Bar Under the Cross – stands for our earth, just as it appears on the miraculous medal.

The Letter M - Immaculate Mary and her devotion to Jesus and her children on earth.

Two Hearts – one being the sacred heart of Jesus and the other the sorrowful heart of Mary.

Crown – The crown of Mary as Queen of the Universe.

1880 – The year our parish was established

And of course we have our ICD colors of blue, white and red!
